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Degrees granted: Bob Jones University is composed of the following schools: the College of Arts and Science, the School of Religion, the Seminary and Graduate School of Religion, the School of Fine Arts and Communication, the School of Education, the School of Business, and the School of Applied Studies (discontinued in 2009).

The School of Applied Studies was based on the junior college model and offered programs leading to one- and two-year certificates and associate degrees.

Programs in the College of Arts and Science, the School of Religion, the School of Fine Arts and Communication, the School of Education and the School of Business lead to associate and bachelor degrees.

Graduate programs are offered by the College of Arts and Science, the Seminary and Graduate School of Religion, the School of Fine Arts and Communication, the School of Education and the School of Business.

Term: Bob Jones University is on the semester system.

Grading key: A student's grade point average (GPA) is computed by dividing the quality points earned by the hours attempted. GPAs reported on BJU transcripts prior to the completion of a degree program are based on credits attempted and quality points earned at BJU only. Once an undergraduate degree has been conferred, the GPA is calculated on the basis of the total hours attempted and quality points gained, including transfer work. GPAs reported on associate and graduate transcripts reflect only BJU work.

Quality points are computed on a four-point scale. Prior to June 1, 1986, the University was on a three-point scale. On June 1, 1986, all records of currently enrolled students and students enrolled after that period were converted to the four-point scale. This transcript indicates the current four-point scale.
